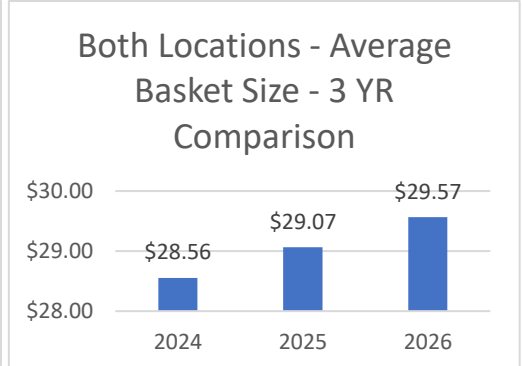
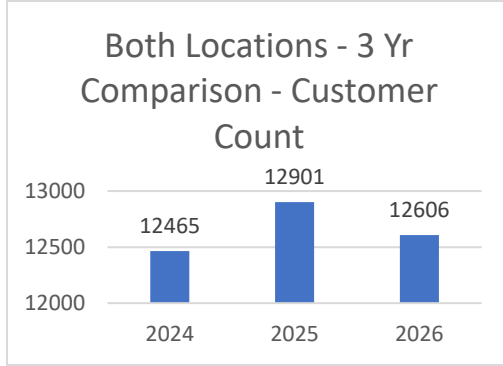
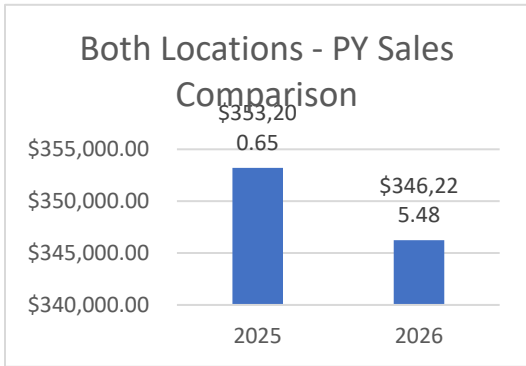

February Sales: \$346,225.48

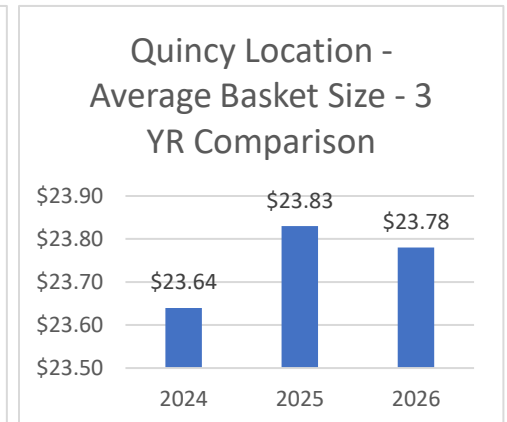
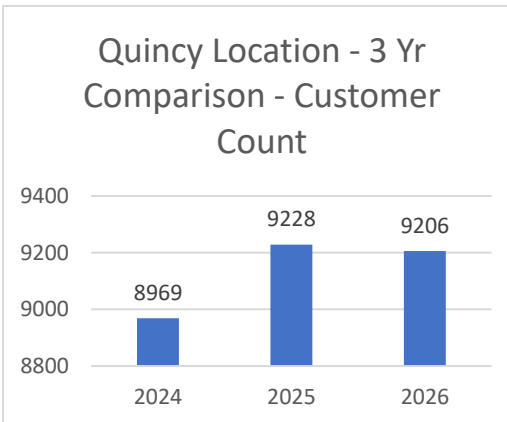
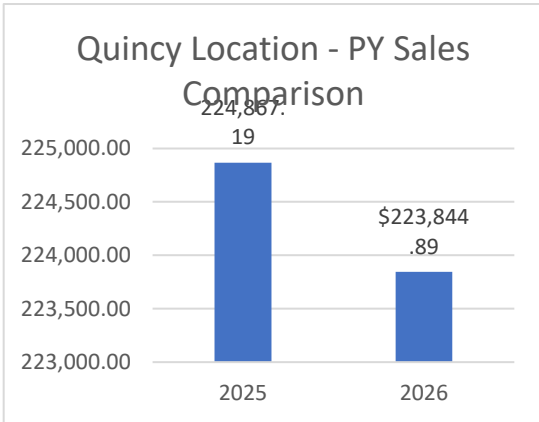
Prior Year Comparison – Decrease of -2.0%

February Sales: \$223,844.89

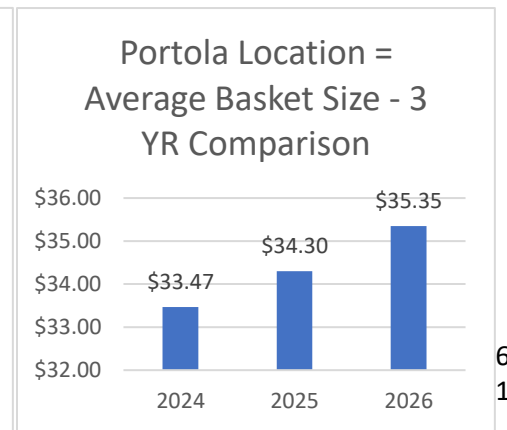
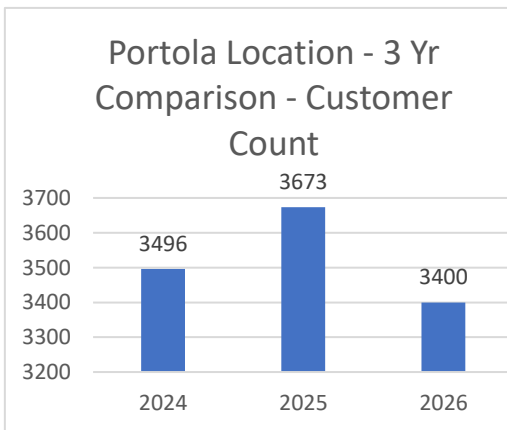
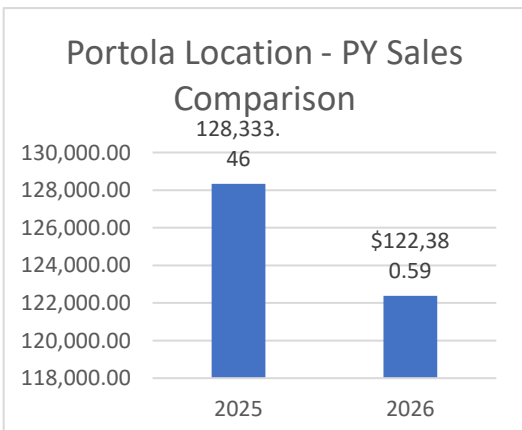
Prior Year Comparison - Decrease of -0.5%

Financial Summary

Overall, both locations saw a decrease in sales of -2.0%. Quincy saw a decrease of -0.5%, while Portola saw a decrease of -4.6%.

Weather Impacts

In February we had a significant snow event that hindered operations. Our deliveries did not arrive, both stores had shorter hours due to the conditions, and generally there were less shoppers. Portola had modified hours on February 17th. Both locations had modified hours on February 18th.

Quincy Sewer Line Issues

On February 16th, the Quincy store was closed a full day due to a sewer line blockage. A plumber showed up, only to tell me they don't work on sewer lines. This person was called the night before and did say they would come and help. I ended up calling a dedicated member owner who knew our building to come help me. We worked together while it snowed to clear the blockage ourselves. This did involve going under the building to investigate sewer lines and cleanouts.

Workshop in Auburn

On February 7th I traveled down to Auburn, CA to join Columinate and my co-op peers for a workshop titled "Stronger Together: Balancing Autonomy and Collective Power". This workshop focused on keeping each co-ops autonomy in the face of change and outside collaboration. Many of the co-ops at the event talked about potential mergers they are considering. We also talked about growth and how to keep our co-op's mission and vision strong during times of change.

Outreach

We hosted Community Supper again this year at the Quincy Methodist Church. We fed about 105 community members a delicious meal of White Bean and Ham soup with cornbread and a salad. Many thanks to our volunteers and board members that helped with cooking and serving this meal to our community.

Quincy Reorganization

In Quincy we have been slowly reorganizing the backstock areas to create more efficiency. We had a large bulk storage area that we were struggling to make work for us. By removing this bulky storage unit, we've freed up more storage and walkway space, and decreased areas for pests to hide in.

Portola Reorganization

The team in Portola has also been hard at work reorganizing. Our bulk section at the Portola store is reorganized, creating a better shopping flow. We also moved our deli and drink cooler up to the front where the soup is located for better flow. Overall, the changes look great and the shoppers are happy.
